

Walton Conrad Glass was born January 26, 1941, in Asheville, North Carolina. His father worked for Morrison Knudsen in field construction while taking accounting courses in the evening. After several important innovations to Morrison Knudsen from Eardley Glass, the Glass family moved to Boise, Idaho when Wally was 3 years old.

Wally attended Whitney Elementary School, and South Jr. High School. Wally was in the first graduation class at Borah High School. He was always active in the Borah Class Reunions. Wally received two degrees from Boise State University in Business Administration and Accounting.

But Wally's true love was flying airplanes. He took flying lessons at age 14!

He joined the Idaho Air National Guard early 1965 and began Pilot Training October 1965.

After that he was deployed to Soesterberg Air Force Base in Holland.

Wally was a pilot for Boise Cascade and Albertsons for many years.

After marrying Anne Glass, they lived in many towns and states where they built and restored 12 houses. Hawaii was their favorite vacation destination.

When Wally retired, he became a member of the Exclusive Quiet Bird Men Club which is an elite national member-based organization.

He was preceded in death by his parents Eardley William Glass and Bernice Pearl Doyle Glass and his brother Eardley William Glass, Jr. He is survived by his son, Mark Bowling (Kathleen) (Williamton, Michigan) and three granddaughters Anna, Erin, and Molly Bowling.
